Logline

A man's wife is missing in mysterious circumstances. Who, or what is watching over him at night...?

Tagline

When your partner is missing, who's watching over you...?

Synopsis

A man's wife disappears one night, without explanation. Shortly after, the man begins having very lucid experiences during sleep that make him feel as though he is being watched.

He contacts a parapsychologist to record and analyse his sleep in a bid to, once and for all, try and determine the cause and nature of these encounters. The parapsychologist explains that something was caught on film. The man asks if it was his wife. The parapsychologist worriedly breaks the news "I don't think it was your wife" to the man.

The film continues by exploring various possibilities as to who the intruder could be. These include the man's wife, her potential kidnapper, her brother and a ghost. Ultimately, the visitor is proven to not be of a supernatural source, but is a person.

This terrifies the man to know that someone comes into his house every night to watch him sleep. The reveal leads to a struggle to subdue the unwanted guest and find out the truth about the man's wife.

Tone

Alone would be similar in tone to Paranormal Activity, The Strangers, Insidious and It Follows

Characters

Rob (30's, average to tall height, average build)

– Married to Hannah. Rob experiences usual things occurring as he sleeps and seeks to find out the truth, hopefully discovering what happened to his wife in the process.

Dr. Patterson (Late 30's / Early 40's, average height & build)

- Parapsychologist hired by Rob to get to the bottom of his nocturnal problems. Very dedicated to the task in hand.

Hannah (30's, average height, build etc.)

- Married to Rob and currently missing. Has non-specified illness (similar to Multiple Sclerosis) and seeks independence. Was broken by diagnosis, but strong willed.

Continuation

There is the possibility of a continuation, as the end of the film indicates that Hannah's blood is found. However, if in the UK, the police do not hold a DNA database, except for known criminals. This would allow for several sequels as a case is built and discoveries are made.
